Thanks to the total commitment and sacrifice of leaders like you, Utah's tech industry continues its meteoric growth, having recently achieved national recognition as a "Super Sector." Your vision and determination have helped us accelerate innovation like never before, and drive our state to become the hottest tech spot in the country.


I have been privileged to be engaged in Utah's remarkable dynamism working closely with state legislators, governors and other key decision makers over the years to ignite Utah's capital investment and bolster talent development at all K-20 levels. Looking back, I am proud of our accomplishments.

- We fundamentally changed the early-stage capital structure of the state by creating the \$121M Utah Fund of Funds, which has attracted more than 250 venture capital and private equity firms and helped make Utah one of the top 10 most attractive VC states with \$170M invested in 19 deals in Q4 2016 alone.
- As a result, we created a nice problem to have: Finding the talent to fuel the growth of our 6,000 tech companies, representing 10% of Utah's total payroll. Two of our answers were to create the \$40M Stem Action Center, scaling digital learning opportunities, and building the STEM Mentor Exchange app, to match needs of thousands of K-12 teachers with industry resources.
- We significantly expanded Utah's STEM talent supply with our Engineering Initiative, which helps power innovation from growing numbers of computing and engineering graduates. Since the Initiative launched in 2001, Utah's forward-thinking \$248M investment, which includes a 1:1 match from university presidents, has greatly increased our talent capacity and impacted thousands of Utah companies.

As CEO of UTC for 17+ years, it has been my honor to work closely with hundreds of trustees and thousands of our members. I have loved championing the cause of our world-class tech CEOs and their teams! Through *Executive Forums and by unifying the voice of the industry,* we continue to reach new milestones and build relationships with our amazing members.

As I prepare to embark on the next phase of my career, I'm excited for the Executive Committee and Board to hire the next CEO who will be capable of creating UTC 3.0 with your help! I definitely appreciate your stellar support and confidence. When I look back, I'm awed by what we've achieved together!



STRATEGIC PRIORITIES





Utah businesses constantly face a shortage of talent to fill many high-paying, hi-tech positions. Temporarily, the gap must be fulfilled by out-of-state talent or overseas contract workers. To help keep hi-tech jobs in Utah, UTC works with education leaders in K-12 and higher ed to support STEM education initiatives and create greater incentive for students to enter STEM related fields and fill jobs with Utah tech companies.

EXECUTIVE FORUMS

UTC hosts an Executive Forum Series for CEOs, CTOs, CFOs, and HR Executives to share best practices and mentor each other. These peer groups are reserved for the most senior person responsible for these areas of the business.

"JA-IN-A-DAY" UTC partners with Junior Achievement to bring top business, government, and community leaders to "teach a class" for a day. Nearly 100 executives have had the unforgettable experience of teaching more than 70 "title one" elementary school classes, many are at Edison Elementary which UTC is adopting.







TECHHIRE UTAH

UTC led the partnership with Innovate +Educate, Pluralsight, UVU, SLCC and UCAP to skill-up a tech talent pipeline. Together we created the TechHire Utah pilot project.

Every month top experts provide best practices on legal, accounting, PR, marketing and venture capital funding.



COUNSELORS SUMMER CONFERENCE

UTC invited Governor Herbert to highlight his education agenda to more than 900 high-school counselors at the Counselors Summer Conference. We also had 24 of the state's top tech leaders present to counselors on preparing kids for the hot jobs of the future.

ENGINEERING INITIATIVE

Utah's visionary \$248 million investment to date (including university presidents' 1:1 match) has significantly increased the states talent capacity. It has doubled the output of engineering grads and tripled the output of computer science grads.

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT'S ROUNDTABLE

UTC assembled the first ever roundtable discussion series with the four major university presidents, their board leaders, and top tech CEO's throughout the state in an effort to align talent development efforts to huge industry demands.

STEM MENTOR EXCHANGE

The STEM Mentor Exchange is a mobile "matching" app designed to connect thousands of teachers with industry mentors, and provide educators access to industry resources and opportunities.

Co-sponsored with Stoel Rives, we celebrated the 15th Annual Utah Innovation Awards with more than 400 attendees who gathered to celebrate eight award winning innovations chosen from more than 100 nominations.

PUBLIC POLICY ACHIEVEMENTS

PASSED & FUNDED 6 OUT OF 6!

The results of the 2017 legislative session were extremely productive for Utah's tech community. We applaud the Governor and state legislature for all of their efforts to fully support Utah's tech ecosystem. We also greatly value the engagement of UTC's members. Without their support, we would not have been able to accomplish all that we did. We will continue our robust public policy process through the interim period with continued member engagement. Please come join us!

HIGH-PRIORITY SUPPORT LEGISLATION

Engineering Initiative – APPROVED FUNDING

Again, UTC drove the \$8M in new funding to increase tech graduate capacity (with University Presidents' 1:1 match)! Thanks to the eight Universities/Colleges who were an integral part of increasing the total funding to \$38M, annually.

This initiative will assist in:

- 1) recruiting more faculty in high demand disciplines;
- 2) building capacity by creating more class sections and developing online alternatives;
- 3) boosting retention through academic advising and career counseling; and
- 4) strengthening outreach to women and underrepresented minorities.

S.B. 190, Education Computing Partnerships (Sen. Okerlund and Rep. Last) - PASSED

Thanks to the outstanding support of bill sponsors, the State will invest \$1,255,000 annually into K-12 computing education and talent development in Utah.

S.B. 220, Student Assessment and School Accountability (Sen. Millner and Rep. Last) - PASSED

This bill aspires to be an upgraded, "zip-code neutral", update of Utah's school accountability system. SAGE testing in high school would be replaced with ACT Aspire, and any school meeting the established criteria would receive the appropriate letter grade independent of the performance of other schools.

H.B. 253, Short-Term Rental Amendments (Rep. Knotwell and Sen. Adams) - PASSED

This bill reinforces homeowners' rights to offering short-term rentals. (e.g. Airbnb)

SUPPORT LEGISLATION

S.B. 117, Higher Education Performance Funding (Sen. Millner and Rep. Wilson) – PASSED

This establishes a formula for our UCAT [Utah College of Applied Technology] system on performance-based funding and in the USHE [Utah System of Higher Education] system. If an institution is meeting their goals, they would receive funding. The goal is to focus on completion and outcomes.

S.B. 132, Vehicle Manufacturers Tax Amendments (Sen. Bramble and Rep. Gibson) - PASSED

This bill expands single sales factor and removes the sales tax penalty on business inputs for certain vehicle manufactures.
